- Give your pastor's spouse the freedom to be themselves and to find their own niche at the church.
- Let your pastor's children "be kids," care about them, and pray for them.

- Prepare a meal or baked goods for them (ask about favorite meals or certain foods to avoid).
- Give your pastor a gift card for restaurants, fast food or coffee shops.

- Give your pastor food from your garden, orchard, hunting or fishing trips.
- Invite your pastor and family to your home or a restaurant for a meal.
- Invite your pastor and family to go fishing, sailing, camping, hunting, to the gym, concerts, plays or sporting events. Offer to cover some or all of the costs.
- Offer your pastor's family sports, concert or event tickets.
- If you have a vacation home, timeshare, recreational vehicle or camping gear, offer to let your pastor use it.
- Share frequent flyer miles that can be used for conferences, vacation, mission trips or holiday travel.
- Offer your pastor the use of your dependable vehicle, SUV or minivan for a holiday family trip or vacation,

Share your skills and time to help with any of the following items:

FINANCES



PAY IT FORWARD

Most people have heard about "paying it forward." Do you know you can also pay it forward by passing along possessions you no longer use or need? Ask if the items you may have available are actually needed and wanted by the pastor's family. Also, be sure they are in good condition and will not need costly repairs.

Note: Please be prepared to graciously allow your pastor to decline anything that you offer. Also note that most items mentioned here are not normally tax-deductible to the giver, but are to be given out of gratefulness to God for what he has given to you to Bless Your Pastor.

Building and Grounds Update

The new roof on the "Education"/Fellowship Hall wing has been installed at the contracted price, \$41,261. We are currently raising funds to pay for this work. The Eaton Foundation loaned the congregation the funds to pay for the work. The Trustees paid \$10,000 out of their long-term investment account and the congregation has raised an additional \$18,553 as of August 31, 2021.

The long-awaited work on the parking area at 500 State Street is wrapping up. Since last reported:

- Fines have been added to the gravel and leveled. It will be rolled shortly.
- Bumper stops and the handicap parking signs have been installed.
- Two light poles and lights have been installed.
- Electric service pole has been installed along with the electrical panel.
- Yet to be completed by Duquesne Light: electric meter installed and service connected.

Two other major projects have begun in September.

- A concrete ramp will be installed from the Fellowship Hall to the stage/Sunday School hall level. This ramp will
 provide handicapped accessibility to all levels of the church building as well as make the movement of food for the
 We Care Food Pantry much safer and more convenient. This project is being funded by both the GIFT campaign
 and the We Care Food Pantry. The building permit for this project has been acquired and we're waiting for a start
 date from the contractor.
- 2. The street-level entryway to the sanctuary (northeast corner) will be modified with wider doors and automated door openers. New concrete sidewalk, retaining wall, drainage and handrails are part of this project. The building permit for this work is also "in-hand". This project is being funded by the Eaton Foundation as a memorial to Doliver Pierce.

We want to thank you for your faithful giving toward these needed improvements and maintenance. Ultimately, our aim is to be an effective part of God's kingdom on earth, providing a safe, accessible and functional place for God's Word to be shared.

 - __ 1 Comb Must be sturdy with at least 6" of teeth, no pocket combs or picks.
- ____ 1 Toenail or fingernail clipper No emery boards or metal nail files.
- ____ 1 Bath Soap, size 3 oz. or larger No Ivory or Jergen's soap. Do not remove packaging.
- ____ 1 Adult Toothbrush: No multipacks, keep in packaging.
- ____ 10 Adhesive bandages 3/4" x 3 " size.
- ____1 gallon size resealable plastic bag.

Important Notes:

- All items must be new.
- Do not wash any of the items
- Do not include any personal notes, money, or additional materials in the kits.
- Contents of kits or the containers of kits should not be imprinted with cartoon characters, advertisements, or have camouflage print.
